available for all IMF member countries since 1995

supplements ESA for an in-depth view on international transactions (goods, services, capital)

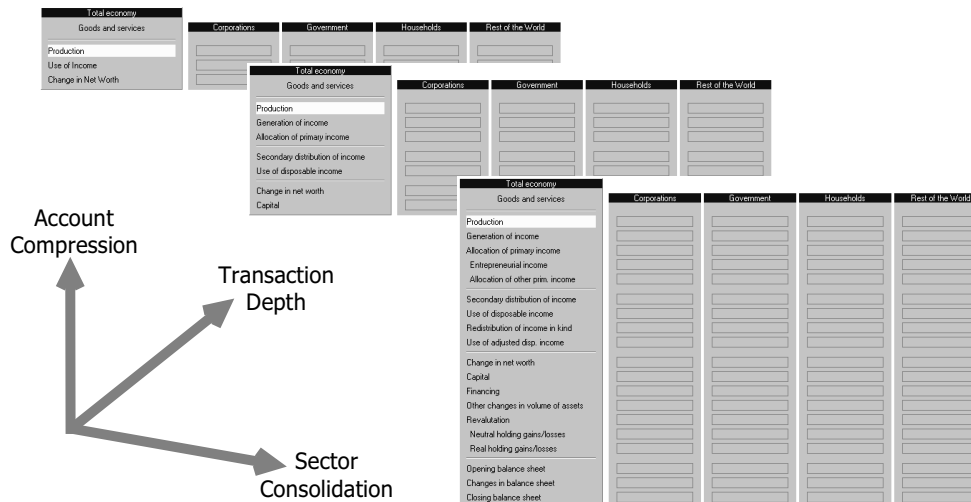

A single language for computer communication ...

Data exchange between ACTAS and other applications (via Excel, Clipboard or COM) is based on international standards for accounting data description (transaction, sector and account codes)

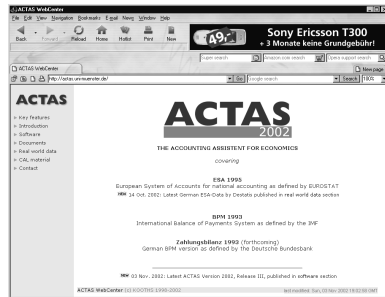
... but a multi-language GUI
